



Endurance Award: Promise & Law

For your Crean Endurance Award, you need to 'Implement the Scout Promise and Law, and lead by example to others'. You should spend a short time thinking about these ideas and discussing them with your PL and/or Scouters. These discussions can happen in your Patrol Corners or on a camp, or during Patrol Leaders' Council meetings.

Reflect and Commit:

Either with your PL, or if you're an APL or PL, with a Scouter or others at a PLC meeting, look through the different parts of the Scout Promise and Law and think of practical examples of how you implement them in scouting and in your daily life. You can do the same exercise for leading by example. For example, for friendly you could say Hi to passers by in your estate and make an effort to talk to the new Scouts in your Troop; or for trustworthy, you could talk about how you follow through on tasks you agreed to do; or for brave, talk about how you challenged yourself by going out of your comfort zone. Then, commit to making a conscious effort to following the Scout Promise and Law even more in the next few weeks. For example, for honesty try to whittle out the 'little white lies'; or for respectful, use manners when ever you can.

Photo Record:

Agree with your PL or Scouter to work on thinking about how you 'Implement the Scout Promise and Law, and lead by example to others' over a few weeks. Use your phone or a disposable camera to take photos of good examples; such as helping another Scout learn a new skill, helping your grandparents or a neighbour with the groceries, or picking up litter. Afterwards, you can select a number of examples to show and discuss with your PL and Scouter. You could also put together a collage for your Patrol Board or have the photos posted to the Group or Troop's social media.
